





past continuous + WHEN+ past simple I was studying when my mum entered to my room USE: something that was happening continuously in the past when another action interrupted it. "El pesao nos corta la acción" WHILE: during the time

WHEN: at the time

## was/were + verb-ing

<u>Remember</u>: usually STATIVE VERBS are NOT used in the progressive (-ing) form

Use

Interrupted action in the past They were waiting for the strain when I spoke to them.

Form

#### **Parallel** actions

I was studying while my brother was watching TV.

#### Past habit

My mom was always complaining about my room when she got there.

Specific time as an interruption Last night at 6 p.m., I was eating dinner.

Use

#### A series of parallel actions

When I came to the school, the school bell was ringing, many students were running towards the garden, teachers were going out from classrooms.

### Emphasis of length of action

I was working in the garden all day.
She was preparing the meal all the morning.

#### Story background

While I was driving to work yesterday...

#### Arrangement in the past

I was upset because I was leaving this place that morning.



when, while, always, constantly, at that time, in those days, all day, all the morning, all evening, for hours, at this time...
